# Health Partners Broadens Reach in Miami County Care

22 Troy Rotarians and guests Stan Evans (Tipp) and JoAnn Swank (member Dan's wife) welcomed Health Partners Free Clinic Executive Director Justin Coby (pictured) to LaPiazza, our January home away from home.

Justin gave us an update on the goings on at the Clinic, which has grown in services and responsibilities since then-Director Deb Miller spoke to us last.

The Clinic's demand continues to grow and their ability to serve as well. While they used to host 17 hours of walk ins and appointments per week, thanks to an additional full-time Nurse Practitioner, they now host 46 hours.



The Clinic spent \$3.3 million in providing medical services in 2013, seeing 1,000 unique clients over 4,000 visits. 2,400 lab work ups were done, with 16,000 prescriptions dispensed. The Clinic's clients are, by necessity, those that are uninsured or underinsured and who are typically between the ages of 35-55.

The Clinic is funded through various grants, foundations, United Way agencies, corporate sponsors, individual donors, local churches and clubs, and fundraising.


Rob didn't talk about the war per se, as thousands of authors before him have done. Rather, he wrote a book in 2013 titled <u>Vietnam On My Mind</u>, which consists of a series of 10 vignettes about the Vietnamese people with whom he came in contact during 1972 when he was stationed there.



Rob enlisted in the Navy after receiving his degree in Civil Engineering and becoming bored. He was called to duty in late 1971 and served until the war "ended" in January of 1973. During that time, he served with the Naval Advisory Group as a liaison officer with the Vietmanese.

He provided a wonderful overview of the time period, physical beauty and geography of Vietnam, without expounding on the individual stories in the book. Tom first spoke about the history of the Dragons, which have been a part of Dayton since 2000. Since that time, fans have broken the record for most consecutive sellouts – selling out every single game since 5<sup>th</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Stadium opened on April 27, 2000. They broke the **professional sports** record for consecutive sellouts on July 9, 2011 by filling the stadium for the 815<sup>th</sup> time. To date, they have sold out 983 consecutive games and are on pace to break 1,000 games in 2014.



The Dragons, a Class A minor league affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds, have had 63 players "graduate" to the MLB. Notable names include Joey Votto, Jay Bruce, Adam Dunn, and Austin Kearns. A former Dragon to watch on the Reds this coming season is Billy Hamilton, slated to be the starting Center Fielder for Cincinnati on opening day.

Dragons games have always been marketed as an entertainment experience, rather than simply another baseball game. Thus, the non-stop activities between innings are focused on families and the total entertainment experience.



### **Serving All Who Are Hungry**

31 Troy Rotarians, including new members Todd Severt and Justin Coby, as well as Assistant DG Mark Mabellitini and guests McKay Featherstone, Alice Murphy, and Tom Jent traveled to the new Hobart Community Kitchen on the corner of Mulberry and East Main Streets.



Hosted by Director Dick Steineman and Rotarian Greg Taylor, the group took a tour of the outstanding new facility, which replaces the former St. Patrick's Soup Kitchen on East Main Street.

The soup kitchen was started in 1997 on New Street as a weekend service for the hungry of Troy. It moved to its East Main location two years later, where it has served dinner meals most if not every day of the week.

In 2011, representatives of the ITW/Hobart Foundation called asking to donate significant funds to improve the services here in Troy. They promptly committed \$330,000 in cash plus another \$200,000 in state-of-the-art kitchen equipment. Harlow Builders broke ground in July of last year, culminating in a grand opening in January.

The facility consists of a basement storage area, first floor kitchen and dining areas, and a second floor full of conference rooms. Local non-profit community groups are welcome to reserve the second floor any time they need it.

The soup kitchen serves dinner to approximately 80-100 people, Mondays through Fridays, and one Sunday per month. Other than two paid staff, the entire operation is put on by individual volunteers and groups. Rotarian Richard Bender suggested – and by inference, volunteered as Chairman – that perhaps a group of Troy Rotarians could volunteer once a month or quarterly as a project. Harumphs of support were heard all around.



### Riding Can Be Therapeutic

24 Troy Rotarians and guest Jannine Pratt welcomed Eagles Wings Stables' Assistant Director Kelly Monnin and one of her volunteers, Theresa to this week's meeting.

Kelly (pictured) introduced this Pigua-based therapeutic riding and equine assisted learning center, which was started in 2004 by founder and Executive Director Keith Schaurer.

Certified by the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International, or PATH, the Center focuses on horses to engage in games, therapy, and goals-oriented activities to provide cognitive. social. emotional, and physical recovery to children ages 2 and older, as well as adults.



Many conditions are treated by this therapy, among them including ADD/ ADHD, Autism, MS, Down Syndrome, Head Traumas, Parkinson's, and at-risk youth. While there are fees associated with the Center's activities (health insurance doesn't cover the therapy), there are free programs for veteran's and first responders.

Besides monetary donations, which are always needed, the Center has a constant demand for volunteers willing to walk with the horses to support the durina therapy. For more information. please see www.eagleswingsstables.webs.com.

Speaking of our Heywood Partnership, with the winter season possibly finally dwindling (forecast for Sunday notwithstanding), we have distributed only 10 sets of winterwear. However, several Rotarians donated money for this program in late 2013 in advance of their "turn" coming up on the list. The Heywood nurse recently identified some clinic needs for the students, including emergency sweatpants, underwear, socks, and shorts. Jean, Wayne, and Greg all graciously agreed to allow me to use their winterwear contributions to offset the \$230 cost. BBBS serves the counties of Montgomery, Preble, Greene, and Miami. Its mission is to target needy children, including those living in single parent homes, growing up in poverty and coping with parental incarceration. Caseworkers such as Beth match volunteers, or "Bigs" with boys and girls, or "Littles," from the ages of 6-14 years of age. Beth then performs all of the volunteer's background work, sets up an initial meeting, and follows up monthly or weekly to ensure the match continues to be a positive one for both the Big and the Little.

BBBS offers a wide variety of programs to help the Big and Little bond, be active and make a difference in the child's life. Those programs include:

Community-based mentoring, in which the Big and Little meeting in the community away from school

School-based mentoring, in which they primarily meet at school during school hours

Special programs, such as mentoring for African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, and Military children

These volunteers are critical for the success of the BBBS. There are plenty of children but not enough mentors. Additionally, much of the programming is made possible only through donations and contributions.





Randy spoke about teachers across the nation who have been or are true heroes in their communities. Why are they heroes? They change students' lives when no one is looking, they show care and concern for everyone regardless of demographic "station", and the show that concern for everyone they serve, regardless of how challenging that student might be.



Randy admitted that not every teacher is a hero. Too frequent newspaper headlines have proven that. However, there are many thousands of admirable teachers across the U.S. who should be celebrated for their acts, behavior, and inspiration.

Randy identified three examples:

- Shannon Wright, who was the 6<sup>th</sup> grade language arts teacher who died in a deliberate ambush by students who pulled a fire alarm and then too sniper practice on unwitting students and adults alike;
- Jane Smith, who was an incredibly generous inner city middle school teacher who
  donated a kidney to a student with kidney disease; and,
- Jencie Fagan, the phys ed teacher in Nevado who courageously stopped a student with a gun who was shooting students by simply using her body as his shield and telling him she cared.

Randy's book <u>Leave No Child Behind</u> is a fictional demonstration of similar feats of heroism by teachers. It depicts a terrorist takeover of a high school and a teacher's stand against the villains. It's available on Amazon but for more information, see <u>www.heroicteacherpress.com</u>.



Lisa purchased the building and reopened it in 2013, just prior to the Gentlemen of the Road tour weekend. MAC is envisioned to become a multi-purpose operation showcasing visual, theatre, performance, and musical art.

Built in 1928 as a single room movie theatre seating 650-700 patrons, MAC was divided into two and then three screening rooms in the mid-1960s and 1970s. There was an active stage in the back of the building, something Lisa would ultimately like to restore for use in performances.



Currently, MAC hosts various children's after school and adult art classes, as well as a summer camp for 40 kids. In two weeks, MAC will run its first movie, titled "Maiden Trip," an independent film about a 14-year old girl seeking to become the first of her age to sail around the world. ### The Troy Rec, a Place For Community

20 Troy Rotarians and guest Jenny Miller (Bill Lukens) welcomed The Rec Executive Director Nicole Hanes (pictured) to our weekly meeting to talk about their programs and their on-going building renovations.

The mission of The Rec is "To provide a recreational and social environment for the citizens of Troy with the primary emphasis on youth" and the staff and Board of Directors have certainly taken it to heart with their emphasis on after school programs, preschool, summer lunch buddies, and even rentals for sports and other events. They have after school programs for both 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and K-5 grade student groups, which are available to any Troy residents or Troy school attendee.



Friday nights, Saturdays and Sundays, The Rec is closed to the public due to the demand they have for facility rentals. They also run special classes and sports programs.

The Rec has been at its current location at the corner of Water and North Market Streets since 1941 and there are certainly parts of the building that, until recently, showed its age.

However, under Nicole and her Board's leadership and drive, The Rec was able to successfully be awarded over \$300,000 in grants, including a very generous \$125,000 grant from Pat and Tom Robinson.

Renovations to date have been extensive and on-going, with significant interior repairs and upgrades to first floor carpeting, furniture, paint, equipment, and other amenities. The first floor gym has also been refurbished, with a wider footprint due to the removal of some side rooms that reduced the open floor space. The floor surface has also been upgraded to a "space age" material that is virtually indestructible.

Remaining interior work will be to the second floor, including the ballroom/gym area. Also, Nicole and the Board have budgeted significant exterior repairs, including replacement of over 100 bricks, tuck pointing, roof repairs, etc. Those repairs have been accelerated due to the bad winter, which resulted in water leakage and damage to the interior of the building. One side issue that the Board is still considering is the replacement of the brick side historic mural, which has stood for many years as a symbol of Troy's downtown heritage.

### **Lincoln Community Center**



An overflow multitude of 35 members and 3 guests crowded into the Country Club Terrace Room to hear our own Shane Carter, Director of the Lincoln Community Center. Guests were Shawn's able assistant. Nicole Burton; prospective member, Jessica Echols and Bill Lukens' assistant, Jenny Miller.

Shane and Nicole have been running the Center for 2 ½ years with major improvements acknowledged by nearly all observers. The Center has 2 full time and 8 part time employees (6 of whom have college degrees).

Shane expressed his appreciation to Rotary and all who have helped in the successful transformation of the Center. Currently there are about 60 programs to benefit the community, particularly the youth of the area. One of the most successful operations is the Afterschool Program wherein participating students receive academic assistance from the Center's staff, including retired teachers. Currently, 32 of the students are on the Honor Roll! To demonstrate the seriousness of academics, during the Afterschool Program (2:30 – 5:00) there is no basketball. Demographics present obstacles to a significant number of the participants. A majority of the students in the Afterschool Program don't have fathers living in the home.

Other programs include a farmers market (which will sell produce to raise funds), "life skills", health screening, field trips, Spanish, keyboarding, genealogy, and recreational activities. Much of the funding comes from the Troy Foundation. Further, the Center has partnered with Brukner for "wildlife" experiences". Shane hopes to acquire a van to improve field trip opportunities.

At the conclusion of Shane's presentation, the club worked on stuffing Easter eggs for the upcoming Easter Egg Hunt, to be held April 19<sup>th</sup> at the Lincoln Center.

### **Partners in Hope**

This week, 23 members, 2 Piqua Rotarians and 2 prospective members attended our meeting. Visiting from Piqua were David Galbreath, and President-elect Stacy Wall. Troy Librarian, Rachelle Miller and our speaker, Jessica Echols are prospective members.

Jessica Echols has been Executive Director of Partners in Hope since August. The organization began in 1990 when 17 local churches decided to consolidate services for local people in need. The desire was to provide one source for a variety of services, eliminate the inefficiencies of duplication and prevent "double dipping" by individuals seeking benefits.



Partners in Hope has five full and part-time staff members; however, much of the work is performed by volunteers. Funding comes from a variety of agencies, such as United Way, the churches and the Troy Foundation. Further, other local organizations contribute goods and services. Troy Ford provides space where volunteers and clients can work on their cars Rotary provides shoes to the children.

Although it began to meet basic, immediate needs, e.g. food or utility payments, its service have expanded. Now, education is an important factor. Beyond traditional education, "Partners" focuses on "bridges out of poverty" with assistance in budgeting and helping clients to understand how the middle class works and how to work with businesses such as banks. Other services include tax preparation and clothing for clients to wear to job interviews.

Although eligibility for most services are income based, "Care Givers" provides transportation to anyone over 55. Last year, over 300 rides were provided.

Clients are expected to "give back" through small monetary donations or working in the various programs.

### The House That Hayner Built - 100 Years Later

35 Troy Rotarians and guest Father Hank welcomed Hayner Cultural Center Executive Director Linda Lee Jolly (pictured) to our weekly meeting to talk about the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the building of the Hayner Mansion.

The Mansion was built in 1914 by Mary Jane Hayner as her and her daughter's residence, using the vast wealth her father accumulated form the whiskey business. Before she passed in 1942, Mrs. Hayner donated the property to the Troy City Schools for their use. At that time, schools were the principal community meeting places and she felt that the Mansion would be a wonderful focal point for gatherings.



After Mrs. Hayner died, the Mansion became the first home of the Troy Library, which it served for the next 30 years. Over the years, the Mansion has been home to many art exhibits, musical recitals, community meetings, private weddings, and other events. It has been supported for many years by a separate property tax levy.

To celebrate the Mansion's birthday, the Center will be hosting a series of events and programs, including the "Whiskey Run" on May 9<sup>th</sup> and culminating in the grand finale three day "Hayner Days" event from August 9<sup>th</sup> through August 11<sup>th</sup>. Hayner Days will include entertainment, shows, food, crafts, a special concert and a light show.

### **Providing a Safe Haven in the Tri-County Area**

26 Troy Rotarians, Assistant DG Mark Mabellitini, and Piqua Rotarian Jack Newanschwander welcomed Safe Haven Executive Director Doug Metcalfe (pictured) to our meeting.

Doug spoke about his facility, which serves the three counties of Miami, Darke, and Shelby. Funded in part by the Tri-County mental health levy and through United Way support, SH provides support services for children and adults with mental health concerns.




As a non-medical facility, SH is not eligible for federal assistance. They offer vocational services, classes, social interactions, employment, life and cooking skills, games and entertainment. Some classes include smoking cessation, self-esteem, coping, working with caregivers, etc. Social opportunities include holiday parties, field trips, galas, and even a temporary restaurant for Thanksgiving.

All events, programs and projects are free, although SSD receipts often pay a small fee for some services they receive. Also included is a free meal once a day in a setting that is as similar to a structured school day as possible.

Safe Haven is meant to complement and not replace medically necessary support services such as counseling. SH often receives referrals from the court system, hospitals, police agencies, etc.

#### **Our Vision:**

In 1996, Dolly Parton launched an exciting new effort, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, to benefit the children of her home county in East Tennessee, USA. Dolly's vision was to foster a love of reading among her county's preschool children and their families by providing them with the gift of a specially selected book each month. By mailing high quality, age-appropriate books directly to their homes, she wanted children to be excited about books and to feel the magic that books can create. Moreover, she could insure that every child would have books, regardless of their family's income.

#### Making A Difference:

Dolly's Imagination Library became so popular that in the year 2000 she announced that she would make the program available for replication to any community that was willing to partner with her to support it locally. Since the initial program launch in the United States, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library has gone from just a few dozen books to nearly 40,000,000 books mailed to children in the United States, into Canada and across the proverbial pond into the United Kingdom!

Currently over 1600 local communities provide the Imagination Library to almost 700,000 children each and every month. Already statistics and independent reports have shown Dolly Parton's Imagination Library drastically improves early childhood literacy for children enrolled in the program. Further studies have shown improved scores during early literacy testing.

The Troy Library introduced this program in January of this year and since then 1,335 children have been enrolled. Enrollees are children from birth through age 5. They receive one book, every month, for 60 months. The cost to the Library (children receive the books for free) is \$25 per year per child. That cost has been offset by the Ada Preston endowment, as well as donations, a United Way earmark, and the Troy Foundation. Rotary International has also made this a national initiative. The organization offsets all administration costs, meaning every dollar donated goes toward books!

Sophia is a court advocate for victims of domestic violence, which brings her in contact with many victims and abusers on a daily basis. Her job can be dangerous, as she sometimes has to lead interventions, placements, violent suspects, etc.



She is well-versed in the many programs and resources the Shelter offers. These include not only representing victims of domestic violence, but also providing temporary shelter for homeless adults and families.

Their services are free and paid for by donations, foundation grants and United Way contributions. The only paid service they offer is anger management classes, which Sophia points out is not only a worthwhile alternative to jail for abusers but a long term deterrent for those who might think twice after having to pay for six weeks of classes!

#### **MCRC - Where Client Care Comes First**

23 Troy Rotarians and guests David Galbreath, Joan Smoke, and Deb Hoying welcomed Thom Grim, Executive Director of the Miami County Recovery Council (MCRC).

MCRC is Miami County's resource for drug and alcohol treatment and was created 37 years ago. Located across from the new Subway restaurant on North Market Street, for their first 34 years, they were a counseling center for drug and alcohol issues. Their referrals come mostly from the court system but they cater to all ages and needs. In 2011, they added mental health counseling services, in recognition of the fact that many addictions are psychologically-based.



Their focus is very client-based, meaning they treat all degrees of abuse, from recreational to hard-core addictions. They are funded by the Tri-County property tax levy, as well as through the United Way, donations, state of Ohio (although, no surprise, the state has cut funding by 25%), donations, and through their major annual fundraiser, a 5K run.

Tom was excited to announce two new programs MCRC has initiated. First, they opened a Piqua office on Looney Road, to cater to the 35% of their clientele from that community (Troy at 35% and the rest of Miami County at 30% make up the other clientele). Second, MCRC recently received a grant from UVMC to fund a collaboration that diverts mental health patients from UVMC emergency room to MCRC services, thus keeping health care costs down while serving those with critical mental health needs.

Last week, 20 Troy Rotarians and 3 guests heard Tony Forshey talk about the development and evolution of Ohio's wild animal legislation. Tony was called back from a conference in Chicago on Oct 19, 2011, to help the Ohio Dept of Agriculture deal with the situation in Zanesville, OH. An owner of dozens of wild animals committed suicide and released his animals into the woods and neighborhoods around Zanesville on a dark and rainy night.



Tony provided a list of wild and dangerous animals now regulated by the State. All "the usual suspects" like lions, tigers, and bears were included, but did you know that Dusky and Masked Titi Monkeys are on the list? How about Yellow or Green Anacondas over 12 feet? Alligators? Hippos? Seriously.....Hippos?

Tony also regaled us with some of his harrowing encounters with these animals after drug busts or meth lab take-downs. According to Tony, the pet of choice for these folks is no longer the Pit Bull; it an alligator!

#### Ever wonder why the Rotary year begins 1 July?

The international convention initially played a key role in determining the start date of our fiscal and administrative year. Rotary's first fiscal year began the day after the first convention ended, on 18 August 1910. The 1911-12 fiscal year also related to the convention, beginning with the first day of the 1911 convention on 21 August.

At its August 1912 meeting, the Board of Directors ordered an audit of the International Association of Rotary Clubs' finances. The auditors recommended that the organization end its fiscal year on 30 June to give the secretary and treasurer time to prepare a financial statement for the convention and board, and determine the proper number of club delegates to the convention.

The executive committee concurred, and at its April 1913 meeting, designated 30 June as the end of the fiscal year. This also allowed for changes to the schedule for reporting club membership and payments. Even The Rotarian changed its volume numbering system to correspond to the fiscal year (beginning with vol. 5, July 1914).



#### **Club Visits Oldest Building in Troy (Maybe)**

18 Troy Rotarians and guest Jane Rudy were welcomed to the St. Patrick's Soup Kitchen to eat and then walk across Water Street to tour the historic Overfield Tavern Museum. We welcomed Terry Purke, local historian and Overfield's resident scholar, who led the tour in costume (Terry is pictured at far right in the aforementioned costume).



Overfield Tavern Museum website, <u>www.overfieldtavernmuseum.com</u>, states it well in recapping the history of the Tavern, its owner and its community:

Mr. Overfield welcomed pioneer settlers to his tavern 200 years ago. Today his home and tavern welcome students and visitors.

The tavern was the center of action in the small settlement community of Troy, Ohio — a place to meet area residents and travelers, to find society, comfortable lodging and good food and drink. Until 1811 the County Court met in an upstairs room of the tavern. The tavern also housed the local Masonic Lodge, one of the first in the state of Ohio.

As a historical landmark, the Museum has been meticulously restored to reflect life in the early 1800's. It now contains a rare collection of early 19th century furniture, household items and artifacts. This collection represents the type of items that travelers would have brought with them to the area and those that settlers would have crafted with local materials. Each room of the tavern has been decorated to reflect it's original use. The museum annex houses an art gallery, a classroom for visiting school groups, and a library.

You are invited to visit the museum. Groups and school classes can arrange special tours. Come, experience the simplicity and beauty of frontier life. Rediscover your past by visiting the Overfield Tavern Museum today.

The Tavern is the unofficial oldest building in Troy – unofficial because it was common for a time for newer buildings to be constructed around older buildings, without demolishing the older structures.

Regardless, the Tavern is a local treasure that Terry and the staff at the Museum take great pride and care in not only preserving the history but graciously sharing their knowledge to Trojans young and old.



### When Acting Goofy May Be More Than Just a Personality Trait



22 Troy Rotarians welcomed one of our own, Tammy Christian (pictured in a candid moment), as this week's speaker. Tammy, a marketing executive with UVMC Occupational Health Clinics, spoke about workplace drug testing policies and procedures.

UVMC OH only works with employers (including the City of Troy), to provide pre-employment, random, and reasonable suspicion drug and alcohol testing.

Employers spend a lot of money properly testing employees because statistics show that they lose \$8 billion per year in lost time, lower productivity, injuries, and liabilities. Therefore, it is critical that employers properly test before they hire and are diligent in watching for the classic warning signs that an employee may be using drugs. Those warning signs include: dilated pupils, slurred speech, rapid weight change, seizures, poor grooming habits, smells, nosebleeds, etc.

There are two types of protocols that UVMC is qualified to perform, and which Tammy is certified to screen: USDOT and non-DOT tests. DOT testing is required for certain types of jobs, including truck drivers required to maintain their Commercial Driver's License. Ed. note: all City street employees are required to maintain their CDL, as well). CDL holders are also required to submit to periodic random drug testing, which is not a requirement for many other jobs.

While the non-DOT testing screens for more types of drugs, each has a very strict set of procedures that create a legal chain of custody. Documentation is very formal, as are the testing procedures.

Drug testing in this day and age certainly fits the old adage: "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure."



21 Troy Rotarians welcomed Miami County Dental Clinic Executive Director Claire Timmer (pictured) to talk about the Clinic's mission in not only Miami County but Shelby County, too.

Claire visited our Club on her one year anniversary as Director. She explained that the Clinic, which was established in 2008, provides free and sliding scale fee dental services to uninsured and underinsured Miami and Shelby Countians of all ages.



Services include dental exams, x-rays, cavity filling, extractions, dentures, root canals, crowns, partials and bridges, and other emergency services. Their mission is "to provide quality dental care and oral health education in a safe, compassionate, and accessible environment."

One of their newer services has been the creation of the 3 "Traveling Smiles" portable dental units, where 2 volunteer and one part-time dentists travel to County schools to treat over 500 Miami County elementary students each year. All told, Traveling Smiles provided over \$73,000 in free dental treatment to students in 2013-2014!

The Clinic survives as a 50(c)3 organization through grants, local foundations (including the Troy Rotary Foundation in the past), community donations, the United Way, churches and fundraising. They are located at 1364 West Main Street in Troy. Or, you



### Marching Band Director Asks... Why are there Football Players on my Field?

26 Troy Rotarians and guest Rev. Richard Culp (husband of Leslie) welcomed Troy Schools Director of Band Kathy McIntosh (pictured) to the meeting.

Kathy has directed the band programs at Troy High School for many years. In addition to the local favorite marching band, Kathy directs the concert, pep, jazz, and chamber bands.



Preparation and practice for the football season begins during the summer, often encompassing 14-15 hour days (at least for Kathy and her assistants). During the week-long camp, the 150+ student performers learn all of their positions, movements, and music, with the rest of the pre-season dedicated to perfecting those assignments.

Since 1980 when the first statewide band competition was formed, the Troy Marching Band has earned 33 consecutive superior ratings. Although that's clearly important (I'd hate to be that group that only gets an 'excellent' in the future L), Kathy's overall mission is to mold her performers into better people in the community, building values such as service, respect and trust.

The Band Boosters support the program's budget, which approaches \$110,000 annually, with their annual strawberry donut sales during the Troy Strawberry Festival, as well as various other fundraisers during the year. Many students, who wouldn't otherwise be able to afford the \$380 fee to be in the band, can offset those costs by participating in these fundraisers, making the community's support very important. They've even started an annual mattress sale, which was very successful!

Kathy has taken her bands several times to the Chicago Thanksgiving Day's Parade, as well as the annual New Year's Day parade in London, England.

So, if you're into marching bands, don't miss Kathy and the 157 students who will be performing at all of the home games (and some of the away games) during this year's football season.

The downtown farmers market was started by Troy Main Street in 2010 to showcase downtown Troy with locally owned, operated and grown produce. It opens the second week of June and closes for the season in the second week of September each year. Located on South Cherry Street between West Main and Franklin Streets, it is open from 9 am. until noon every Saturday. The exception will be on its final Saturday of 2014, September 13<sup>th</sup>, when it will be open from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m.



From its inception in 2010 until now, the number of vendors and options have grown exponentially, from 10 vendors to this year's record of 45 local owners. To participate, there is a small weekly fee and at least 75% of the goods to be sold must be grown by the vendors themselves.

Utilitzing the concept of marketing that is historically the oldest used by small farmers, the TFM hosts very unusual vendors, such as the End of the Road farm, Bad Seed Mustard Co., and Michelle's Macaroons.

### Miami County CASA - Advocating for our Unfortunate Little Ones

Several Troy Rotarians welcomed Jennifer Sanders, Executive Director of Miami County CASA to the meeting.

The mission of CASA, short for <u>C</u>ourt <u>Appointed Social Advocates</u>, is "...to provide a Court Appointed Special Advocate /Guardian Ad Litem (CASA/GAL) to each abused and neglected child for whom placement is being determined by Miami County Juvenile Court."



CASA programs began in Ohio in 1980 in Lucas County. Since then, 32 counties across the state have formed. In 1995, Miami County formed its program, which now places hundreds of abused and neglected children annually into safe, permanent, nurturing homes. MC CASA staff volunteers represent and advocate for the best interests of those children until a permanent solution is found by the court system.

CASA depends on volunteers, training a new group twice a year. Volunteers must go through a thorough screening process, personal interview, reference checks, and a background investigation. Volunteers are the backbone of the CASA program, on whom the children rely for their placement needs.

Funding is provided through United Way and other non-profit support, as well as annual fundraisers, including Kids Night at Culvers in Troy held on July 15<sup>th</sup> and the Troy Kids Triathlon held on July 20<sup>th</sup>. Tax deductible charitable donations are always welcome.

#### Troy City Schools - Financially Sound, and Moving Forward

21 Rotarians welcomed Eric Herman (pictured), Superintendent of Troy City Schools. Accompanying Eric was Jeff Price, District Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer. Eric presented an update on the current state of Troy City Schools.

Eric reported that the school district is in good shape financially, ending last year on a positive note with \$600,000 surplus. In order to support this positive trend, a \$5.9M renewal levy might be presented to voters in May, 2015. This levy will not increase taxes, but will help the district stay in good financial standing.



Currently the School District employs 500 people, 270 of which are teachers. The student population is approximately 4,600, with 41% receiving free and reduced lunch district wide. There are four Title 1 buildings, including Cookson, Heywood, Kyle and Forest. These schools have a large concentration of low-income students and receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting student's educational goals. For an entire school to qualify for Title 1 funds, at least 40% of the students must enroll in the free and reduced lunch program.

Troy City Schools' report card shows an A in Achievement (having met 23 of the 24 possible standards), a B in Performance, an A in 4-year Graduation Rate, and a B in Value Added. Value Added is a new way of analyzing test data that can measure teaching and learning, shows whether students have made the expected amount of progress, and helps "even the playing field" between poverty and achievement rates.

Troy students enjoy many extracurricular programs, including (but not limited to) band, archery, and Pop Rocks; and special events such as Career Day. Along with extensive program offerings, Troy City Schools provides students with state-of-the-art technology district wide, including 1,500 PCs, 530 iPads, and labs in every building.

### **Rotary International Foundation**

27 Rotarians, future Rotarian Barb Lurie, and guest Tracy Haller welcomed Assistant DG Mark Mabellitini (pictured), who spoke about the Rotary International Foundation.

The Rotary Foundation was created by outgoing President Arch Klumph in 1917 as a permanent, ongoing endowment and legacy to demonstrate the international charitable giving potential of this fledging organization.



It was formally established in 1928 and gave its first donation of \$500 to the Easter Seals organization. It was continually expanded from 1947 (when the Ambassadorial Scholarship was created) to the Polio Plus campaign in 1985, to as recently as 2013, when the revised giving policies and programs were launched.

89% of all proceeds go to programs, with only 2% reserved for administrative costs. The Fund has several "pockets" of designated giving to which Rotarians can contribute: The Annual Fund, Term Gifts, and The Permanent Fund.

The Annual Fund is the most popular and when a Rotarian donates \$1,000 s/he can become a Paul Harris Fellow. A \$10,000 donation gets a donor into the Paul Harris Society and those who contribute \$250,000 have the prestigious honor of becoming a member of the exclusive Arch C. Klumph Society (which includes a picture on the Hall of Fame wall at Rotary International headquarters.

Through the Annual Fund, ½ of all donations by Troy Rotarians will come back to District 6670 three years later for use by our clubs. We have used these funds in the past to support District Simplified Grants for our Designated Driver and Shoe Programs.

This is a very worthy program that supplements and complements Troy's envious Troy Rotary Foundation by adding the international charitable component. It also supports our recently modified by-laws. 




Andrew Johnston was recently approached by a representative of the West Milton Rotary Club about an exciting (and easy) future fundraising project that we can hopefully take over in the future.

### Archaeology in Ohio - Mounds and Mounds of Interesting Stuff



21 Rotarians and guests Father Hank (Williamsburg) and David Galbreath (Piqua) welcomed Lynn Hanson (pictured), Vice President of Collections and Research for the Dayton Society of Natural History.

Lynn, dubbed the fastest speaker in Troy for her ability to condense 2.6 million years of Ohio history into 20 minutes, spoke about the flora and fauna that developed and passed through the prehistoric eras in the Ohio region.

Starting in the Pleistocene Era (2.6 million to 12,000 years ago), Ohio hosted many pine and spruce trees, as well as megafauna such as mastodons, sabre toothed tigers and even camels! During this vast period of time, 85% of all species became extinct due to the changing temperatures, overhunting by humans, comets and asteroids, and/or disease.

Next came the Paleo Indian Period, from 13,000-8,000 B. C. Indians dominated the Ohio frontier, hunting and gathering to support themselves, their families and their tribes. They were mobile societies and were very efficient in packing light for quick moves across the prairies.

10,000-1,000 B. C. was known as the Archaic Period, where the settlers developed woodworking tools and skills, pestles for grinding food, tubular pipe and copper. Long gone were the megafauna but hunting and gathering still dominates their societal survival skills.

1,000 B. C. until AD 1,500 was known as the Woodland Period. During this time, Ohio was dominated by first the Adena and then the Hopewell Indians. Early farming began first as gardening hobbies and then for food sustainability. 50% of meals consisted of corn, with beans and squash rounding out the "3 sisters."

This is particularly fascinating in that much of the settlement activity during this era was centered around Chillicothe and the Miami Valley region. The Miamisburg Mound, for example, consists of the unique burial mound custom the Adena perfected to bury their dead. Fired pottery, sculptured pipes and tools, and ceremonial ornamentation became prominent.

Finally, from 1,500 – 1650, contact with European explorers and traders was formed. Sunwatch Indian Village at Ft. Ancient is the best example of that era, documenting living, trading, eating, and working during that time period.

Lynn did a great job encapsulating millions of year's of Ohio's archaeological history but there's much more of the story to be told. So, stay tuned as our program gurus are scheduling a future follow up visit by her.





### Clayton Brukner - Inventor, Philanthropist, Troy Rotarian



26 Rotarians, guest Rotarian Claudia Miller (Modesto, CA) and guest Derek Kester) welcomed Patrick Kennedy, Archivist with the Troy-Miami County Library Local History Library to speak on a very special past Troy Rotarian, Clayton Brukner (pictured).

Clayton J. Brukner was raised in Michigan where he developed a fascination with everything mechanical, mathematical, and scientific. He met his lifelong friend Sam Junkin, who shared his passion for aviation.

After graduating from high school in 1915, both Clayton and Sam joined an aeroplane manufacturer, where Clayton quickly learned it's mechanics. After stints in New York and New Jersey at aeroplane companies, Clayton met Buck Weaver and the three friends formed Weaver Aircraft Co., to be known as WACO.

In 1921, based on inventions and patents created by Clayton, WACO's first practical airplane, the Waco Model 4, was produced. When the company moved to nearby Medina, Weaver left. Two years later, WACO found its permanent home in God's Country, aka Troy.

Clayton led WACO from 1929 to 1938, when WACO became the leading airplane company in the world, sell 2 planes to the competition's 1. WACO planes were sold in 36 countries, making it the most successful aircraft company in the United States at the time.

Following World War II, due to an inability to re-convert the factory to post war production, WACO made the decision to stop producing aircraft. Clayton sold the company to Allied Industries in 1963 and it closed its doors for good in 1965.

Before he passed away on December 26, 1977, Clayton bought and donated more than 150 acres for environmental conservation, creating the Brukner Nature Center outside of Troy. Clayton was also a long-time Troy Rotarian, active in the many programs, projects, and vocations we continue today.

### **Decades of Selfless Service to Miami County**

25 Rotarians Ohio welcomed Representative Dr. Richard Adams (pictured) to this week's meeting. Dr. Adams proceeded to regale the Club with amusing anecdotes and stories of his time in the Ohio Legislature.

Dr. Adams is a long-time public servant in Miami County, having served as the President of JVS, a Miami County Commissioner, and most recently, the past six years as State Rep. During his tenure as Representative, he has gathered many insights into the body of legislators, his constituents, and lobbyists.



According to Dr. Adams, he spends about 30% of his time in Columbus addressing potential legislation, or bills. He continues to be amazed at how little legislation actually makes it to the floor of the House for a vote. Because of the overwhelming imbalance in parties, the majority party rarely will let a bill get to a full vote without the outcome being foretold. The other 70% of the time is spent helping his constituents with issues, problems, research, and intervening on their behalf with various state agencies.

As "amusing" as daily legislative life might have been for Dr. Adams, he admitted that what has been funniest has been his time on the campaign trail, as he's interacted with voters, residents, constituents, and even elementary school classes.

Dr. Adams retires from public service at the end of the current House term, on December 31, 2014. While he has certainly considered it an honor to have been able to serve in so many capacities with, for and on behalf of Miami County, it is clear that the Miami County has been best served by his leadership, wisdom, and enthusiastic support as a tireless advocate on our behalf. We certainly wish him the best in retirement (and encourage his transfer from the Piqua Rotary Club into Troy's membership)!

#### A Soldier's Last Moments in 'Nam

26 Rotarians Ohio welcomed Miami County Lieutenant Sheriff Dave Norman (pictured) to this week's meeting. As a Marine Corporal in Vietnam, Dave had the experience of being one of the absolute last soldiers to evacuate Vietnam in April, 1975 and he shared some of the stories leading up to the perilous ride in the helicopter out of the American Embassy.



Dave spoke about the many hours and days that he and his platoon spend in Saigon helping Vietnamese family, girl friends, workers for the Americans, and of course soldiers evacuate by helicopter to the flotilla in the ocean.

When it was clear that the North Vietnam were about to overtake Saigon and it was equally clear to U. S. Ambassador Martin that the President was not going to send any more ground troops for support, he ordered the immediate evacuation of all American and American friendly personnel.

These included in-Country girlfriends and their families, as well as those Vietnamese who worked for the Americans at the embassy and elsewhere. That was necessary due to the reports of those Vietnamese returning to their villages, only to be killed due to their alliance with us.

And so began a long and drawn out evacuation from the rooftop of the embassy – a process wherein Dave started at a guard but ended up landing the helos on the roofpad! As snipers tried to pick off the soldiers, Dave stood tallest on the roof, an easy target, while trying to safely land enough helos to transport personnel to the ocean. As Murphy's Law would have it, when the last personnel were airlifted and the final marines ready to take flight on the last helo, the previous helo pilot erroneously reported to the ship that there were no more soldiers to transport.

But for the careful eye of a passing American plane who reported to the ship that there were still soldiers on the embassy's roof, Dave and his platoon may have stayed a little longer in Vietnam!

Thanks for a riveting, first hand talk about some pretty brave duty during a time when even our own folks weren't too receptive to our returning soldiers!

### The Way Local Radio was Meant to Be



25 Rotarians Ohio and Assistant District Governor Mark Mabellitini welcomed Scott Hornberger and Lorie Birch Yance of Troy Community Radio (both pictured).

Started in Scott's dining room in 2012, Troy Community Radio (TCR) began broadcasting as an internet station. A year and a half later, A lower-power radio channel became available and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) approved TCR's permit application.

TCR now broadcasts on the web and on FM channel 107.1. Their frequency extends approximately 5-8 miles, covering all of Troy and some of the surrounding areas. TCR employs 7 staffers, providing 18 hours of live programming, with only midnight until 6 a.m. as pre-programmed content.

With a music format that covers the spectrum, TCR also provides original talk radio, with scheduled weekly programs featuring Mayor Mike Beamish (the greatest boss ever!), Troy Main Street, Troy Area Chamber of Commerce, Troy Rotary's own Scott Myers and the County Park District, as well as a partnership with Public Access TV Channel 5, who co-tapes most if not all of the shows concurrently.

Scott is currently in discussions with the Miami County Dispatch Center regarding relocating TCR's antenna to the Center's Tipp City tower. Pending approval by the Miami County Commission and the FCC, TCR would be able to reach a broader audience in Tipp, Troy and virtually everywhere in between.

### **Our Mission is to Eradicate Sex Trafficking**

23 Rotarians and guests Dr. Nancy Luce (Piqua Rotary) and Doug Trostle (Hartstein Committee Chair) welcomed Lisa Baker (pictured), Executive Director of the Piqua YWCA and Lynn Marroletti, former Program Director. Lisa and Lynn spoke about the epidemic problem of human trafficking in the Dayton area.

In case anyone wonders, yes, Human Trafficking (HT) in underage children is very prominent in the Dayton area, largely due to the I75/I70 transportation corridor. Nationally, HT is a \$9.8 billion illicit business, exploiting over 100,000 children per cyear. The average age a child is first forced into prostitution is between 13-15 years old.



The largest pool of victims are runaways, estimated to equal 1.68 million per year. Studies have shown that within 72 hours of running away, 90% of the children are approached by a stranger to lure them into HT. Sadly, the issue is a very near one, as Toledo is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest area, with the Miller Lane corridor the fastest growing area.

Not surprising, drug cartels are one of the greatest exploiters, as they have moved beyond just the heroin trade to capitalize on the addiction's hold on potential HT victims. Equally as sad is the fact that demand is great, making it very lucrative for pimps, who represent over 90% of the HT victims and who can make \$400 per hour per victim.

The YWCA has been focused on education and awareness, using the resources of the Shared Hope International organization. SHI partners with local groups such as the YWCA to prevent trafficking and rescue and restore victims to society.


